

USEFUL ADRESSES FOR UNACCOMPANIED MINORS

Your are an «unaccompanied minor» or «Mineur Non Accompagné (MNA)» if

- You are less than 18 years old
- You are in France without your parents or legal guardians.

→ As an unaccompanied minor, you are considered to be "in danger". You will be protected and taken care of by the Child Welfare Services (the Aide Sociale à l'Enfance (ASE)), if you are recognized as a minor.

In this flyer, you will find the procedures that concern you, your rights and the structures where you can find help.

PROCEDURES

Being **isolated** doesn't necessarily mean that you know no one in France, but rather that you are not with your legal guardians. One of your family members is not necessarily your legal guardian, you will usually need to follow a legal procedure (called a «procédure de délégation») to delegate familial authority or gardianship.

1. Your rights in France

- France has a legal obligation to take care of unaccompanied minors that are on the French territory. It's the Child Welfare Services (ASE), which is managed by the Métropole de Lyon (Greater Lyon), that is in charge of housing and taking charge of unaccompgnied minors.
- Before taking you in, the ASE does an «assessment of your minority and isolation», which means they will ask you questions to determine whether you truly are a minor and are isolated in France.
- Once you have been recognised as a minor and isolated, it will no longer be possible for you to be deported and you will not need a residence permit until you are 18. You will be housed and aided in reaching autonomy (with socio-educational work, schooling or various training opportunities, legal and administrative aid) until you reach 18.

2. Once you arrive in Lyon

To have your minority recognised, you need to go to the «Centre de Mise à l'Abri et d'Évaluation» (CMAE), which will give you an appointment to make an «evaluation» of your minority.

- The CMAE will probably ask you to go to the Prefecture to register your fingerprints and check whether you have already had an assessment in another departement.

• You will be sheltered (accommodated) until the assessment results.

For information, guidance, a card for the social restaurant and French lessons, you can go to the PASS for Minors of the Secours Populaire (refer to page 4).

3. Assessment interview

During the assessment interview with Forum Réfugiés, you will be asked questions about your identity, family, life in your home country (living conditions, schooling), the reasons for your departure and your journey to France, your living conditions since you arrived and your project in France.

- You have the right to an interpreter who speaks your language during the assessment interview.
- Any document (even a photograph) shown to the CMAE will be recorded and may be used during any appeal to the child protection judge.
- You are not obliged to show any documents to be recognised as a minor, but it may help you to prove your minority. If you need help reconstructing your civil status, you can go to an AMIE office (see page 3).

4. Assessment results

Forum réfugiés is responsible for filing a report with the MEOMIE (Child Welfare Service of the métropol de Lyon (Greater Lyon)). It is the MEOMIE that will have the final say in recognising your minority or not. You must check in regularly at the Forum Réfugiés office rue Nevret to find out what the result of your evaluation is. There are two possiblities:

- Either you are recognised as an unaccompanied minor in which case you will be taken care of: you will receive accommodation (either in a home or in a flat, or in a foster family which is more rare), you will get regular follow ups with a specialised educator, you will be able to learn French and go to school or follow a profesional training course to learn a specific trade.
- Either the MEOMIE refuses to recognise your minority and/or your isolation.

5. Appealing before the child protection judge

If they refuse to recognise your minority, they must explain the reasons for this refusal in a document. It is important to keep this document with you, it will be useful in later proceedings. You have the right to contest this decision before the child protection judge. To help you, you can meet with an association.

To appeal before the judge, you must first see a lawyer. The AMIE collective can help you to see a lawyer, or you can also see a lawyer yourself at the Barreau de Lyon.

The judge will then give you an appointment for your case to be heard, and may also ask for verification of your papers and medical examinations, but only with your consent. After examining your file, the judge may recognise you as a minor and isolated, or confirm the refusal of the MEOMIE. While waiting for the judge's decision (approximately 3 months), you will not be accompanied or accommodated by Forum Réfugiés.

6. Requesting asylum

If you have fled your country because you were scared for your life, were persecuted, and you are afraid to go back, you can apply for asylum protection in France at the same time as you go through the procedure for recognising

Before requesting asylum however, we recommend you get in contact with your educator or an organisation that can help you (for addresses of free legal aid, see the Watizat guide: www.watizat.org).

Your educator or your appointed MEOMIE officer can help you make an appointmeent at the «préfecture» (centralised administrative office). The day of your appointment, you must come with a responsable adult (an «ad hoc administrator»). The «préfecture» will take your fingerprints and further information concerning your identity. Designating an administrator might take a while. After this, you will be able to request asylum at Forum Réfugiés.

As a minor, you cannot receive the «allocation pour demandeur d'asile» (ADA - allowance for asylum seekers).

7. Residence permit

You do not need a residence permit if you are recognised as a minor, but you will need one when you turn 18. A residence permit is another way of staying in France legally, other than asylum. There are several different types of residence permits which correspond to different types of situations.

Requesting a residence permit is a complicated procedure which can also be quite risky. It is very important to ask for advice from legal practitioners before starting such a procedure. You should go to a legal aid sessions to discuss your personal situation and prepare your application.

SCHOOL / **COURSES**

School

In France, access to school is a right for all children under 16, whatever their status and their living conditions. School is free and we cannot refuse you access. To register, you must contact the City Hall you are affiliated to based on where you live.

Get in touch with the Secours Populaire for catch up classes to get you up to standard whilst you are waiting to go back to school. If you are currently appealing a decision, contact the AMIE collective to be put in school. If you are recognised as a minor, or if you are a young adult, it is the MEOMIE that is in charge of putting you in school.

«Mission locale»

Individual socio-professional support and follow-up for young people between the ages of 16 and 25, recognised as minors or who possess a residence permit if they are adults. More information on the Mission Locale website: https://www.missionslocales.org/services-pour-les-jeunes/

«Service civique»

From 16 to 25, if you have a residence permit, it is possible for you to do a «service civique» - a social intitiative oriented working contract (lasts from 6 months to a year), paid between 580 and 690€ per month.
