

ARRIVING IN PARIS

YOUR ADMINISTRATIVE SITUATION

You are a foreign national and wish to stay in France: in order to stay on French territory without risking expulsion, you need a residency permit.

There are various options depending on your personal situation (**asylum claim, residency permit request**).

In the box below you will find information on how to start an asylum claim. This is not the only option. These procedures are long and complicated.

 For legal help, you can seek free legal aid (see page 8)

ASYLUM CLAIM

 Call the OFII to book an appointment: 01 42 500 900

⌚ Monday to Friday 9am-4:30pm
Wait for the language option to choose yours. Lots of people are calling at once: waiting times can be long and cut off automatically after 45 minutes. It is advised to call between 2 and 4:30pm to avoid long waiting times. You may have to try several times.

⚠ Careful, this phone number is not free. It will cost you the price of a local call. If you do not have phone credit, go to a day center (see page 13) and the people working there will let you use a phone.

⚠ If you are unable to book an appointment, take screenshots of the calls made to the OFII on your phone. This will help you prove you have tried to call and were not able to reach them.



HOUSING

Emergency accomodation for all



If you are don't have any accomodation, you can call this free emergency number: 115

You do not need a French residency permit to qualify for emergency accomodation.

⚠ Careful, there aren't many spots open so accomodation is not guaranteed and is often only available for a short stay.

We advise you to talk to a social worker in a day center (see page 13).

Accomodation for asylum seekers

During your first appointment at the Prefecture, the OFII should offer you accomodation. Since the waiting time can be long, other housing solutions exist for you before you even start your asylum claim.

⚠ Careful, the French Office for Immigration and Integration (OFII) can offer you a referral for accomodation in another region than the one you filed your asylum claim in. If you refuse to go where they refer you, you will lose your housing and financial benefits (ADA). Your asylum claim may also be canceled.

Access to accomodation will vary depending on your family structure and on your administrative situation. If you haven't submitted an asylum claim yet, you are less likely to be provided with accomodation. Call the OFII number to request housing during your asylum procedure.

The Baron Le Roy Day Center specializes in helping families, couples and single women who have just arrived in Paris.

YOUR DOCUMENTS

⚠ It is very important to keep copies (photos) of all your documents and letters in your name you may be given during your stay in France.

Keep these copies in different places (at a friend's house, with an organization) and online (in your emails...).

Keep track of all your documents as soon as you arrive in France and organize them by theme (health, work, school...)

- They will be useful **during your asylum procedure or in case of arrest** to prove your lawful presence on French territory, and will help organizations better understand your situation.
- **Proofs of your presence in France will be requested if you request a residence permit.** Examples : income declarations (taxes), medical prescriptions, social security notifications, phone and electricity bills, Navigo Pass, domiciliation certificate, paystubs, French class registration and diploma, other letters...

GETTING AROUND

Tickets

The single tickets and 10-ticket packs are no-longer available for single sale at the counter, but rather on the Bonjour RAPT App.

- To replace the single tickets, you can now buy a Navigo Easy pass directly at the station for 2€. This card allows you to buy and load tickets for the Metro, RER or Bus Tram.
- The Ticket Metro-Train-RER costs €2,55 and allows you to travel up to 2 hours on all 3 modes of transport if you remain in the station.
- The Ticket Bus-tram costs €2,05 and allows you to travel on the bus and tram for 1h30, taking several lines, if you remain in the station.

Pass Navigo

This is a travel pass that you can top-up to take the metro, the bus and the RER in an unlimited manner. It costs 90.80€ per month but discounts are available:

- CSS (ex CMU-C) beneficiaries get 75% off
- AME beneficiaries get 50% off
- RSA beneficiaries get it for free

To get a Navigo Pass

Ask for a Navigo Pass at an RATP counter in most metro stations. The pass itself is free. If the RATP agent refuses to issue it, try another counter.

To benefit from the « Solidarité transport » discount

Asylum seekers can get help from the organization where they get their mail (SPADA). If you are not entitled to these discounts you can buy a « Pass Navigo Easy » (2€ for the pass itself) and charge it for 10 trips (17.35€), an unlimited day (20.60€), a week (30.75€), or a month. Get more information at an RATP counter.

LEGAL PROCEDURES



You want to apply for asylum in France



SEEKING ASYLUM means you are asking for a country's protection because you are in danger as you have been persecuted and threatened in your country of origin due to your religion, nationality, political opinion, race or social group (gender, disability, sexual orientation).

Certain persecutions concern **only women** :

- If your **gender** is a cause of persecution: forced marriage, domestic violence, physical abuse, honour crimes
- If the persecution is based on your **biological sex**: risk of sexual mutilation, forced abortions.

To obtain protection in France, you must still be in danger if you return to your country. Seek advice from a specialist organisation, see page 8.

To start your asylum application, you must call the single number for asylum applications: **01.42.500.900** which will give you an initial appointment at: CAFDA (if you have children) in Paris and/or 93, or at a SPADA in Paris and/or 93 (if you are a single woman)

Applying for asylum for your child

If you apply for asylum, your application also applies to any children accompanying you. If you do not obtain the refugee status, but your child finds themselves in danger or has personal fears of serious harm recognised by OFPRA or CND, **he/she may be granted subsidiary protection**.

If you are granted refugee status or subsidiary protection, your children will be able to obtain a resident card, during the year of their 18th birthday.

If your child joins you in France, or is born in France after you have been refused asylum, he/she can **register an individual asylum application**.


If your child was born in France and is at risk of genital mutilation if they return to her country of origin, they may be granted refugee status. You must demonstrate that the child would be at risk of genital mutilation and that their country of origin cannot protect them.

You will need to prove that your child has not already undergone genital mutilation by presenting a medical certificate from the forensic medical unit, Unité médico-judiciaire (UMJ).

To obtain a medical certificate, you can present yourself to:

It is possible that the appointment given by the UMJ may be after your OFPRA appointment. In this case, you must inform the OFPRA agent during your interview and show them the paper with the scheduled appointment date. You can then send the certificate.

Female Genital Mutilations

You can be recognised as a refugee on the grounds of female genital mutilation:

- **if you have not already undergone the procedure:** you will need to present a medical certificate confirming that you have not been circumcised
- if you have been **threatened** to undertake the procedure
- if your country **does not protect you**
You can request a medical certificate from any doctor if you are an adult. For your child, you will need to go to the UMJ (Unité Médico-Judiciaire).

Forced Marriage

You must prove that **you have been threatened or subjected to violence for refusing to marry**. It is very difficult to prove forced marriage and obtain protection on these grounds.

Honour Crimes

Honour crimes refer to violence or murder committed against women by a family member in the name of individual or family honour. **You must prove that your refusal to follow tradition or custom led to you or other members of your family suffering various forms of violence, and that you had to flee your country for this reason.**

Forced Prostitution

If you have been forced into prostitution in **your country of origin**, you may be eligible for refugee status based on your social group. For assistance, please visit the **Bus des Femmes**, see page 9.

Sexual Violence

Sexual violence does not qualify you for refugee status, but it may support another reason for persecution. **For assistance, see pages 9 and 10.**

Assessment of vulnerability

L'OFII assesses your vulnerability in order to **identify your needs**. You will be required to complete a one-page **questionnaire** about your accommodation and special needs. If you are considered vulnerable, you will be given priority for a place in an accommodation centre. Accommodation and the ADA (money paid as part of the asylum application) go hand in hand; if you refuse accommodation, you will not receive the ADA.

You may be considered vulnerable if: you are a minor / ill / disabled / elderly / pregnant / alone and accompanied by minor children / a victim of human trafficking / if you have suffered sexual mutilation and violence.



RESIDENCE PERMITS

My child is recognised as a refugee

Once your child has been recognised as a refugee, you can apply for recognition of your status as a **parent of a refugee child**.

If your child has been granted refugee status, you are entitled to a **residence card**. If your child has been granted subsidiary protection for the same reasons, you are entitled to a **multi-year, renewable residence permit** valid for a maximum of four years.

Applications for residence permits are made on ANEF, the Prefecture's online site. If you have never applied for asylum or a residence permit, i.e. you do not already have a foreigner number (9 or 10-digit number on your asylum application certificate or receipt), you must submit your application on the simplified procedure website.

Once you have obtained it, you can apply for financial assistance (see page 40).

Documents to bring:

- Parent's passport or identity card
- Parent's birth certificate
- Child's birth certificate
- OFPRA decision recognising the child as a refugee
- E-photos

I am a victim of domestic violence

If you are:

- married to a French national and a victim of violence
- a victim of violence by your partner or former spouse and you are a family reunification beneficiary.

If your residence permit depends on your union with this person and you wish to leave the household and/or divorce, you can apply for another private and family life residence permit so that you are not in an irregular situation.

To obtain it, you must prove that you have been abused, obtain a protection order from the family court judge and apply for a residence permit at the prefecture.

1 / To obtain evidence:

- **File a complaint**. You can file a complaint at a police station or gendarmerie. Social workers at police stations can help you. If you are an undocumented immigrant, it is best to have someone accompany you to the police station. You will receive a receipt for your complaint immediately.
- **Medical Certificate**
- **Divorce proceedings on the grounds of fault**

2 / After obtaining protection from the family court judge, you must apply for a residence permit titled 'private and family life' in the prefecture.

To obtain it, you will need to provide the following documents:

- proof of nationality
- proof of address dated within the last 6 months
- 3 passport photos
- the protection order issued by the family court judge

If you are the spouse of a French national, you will be issued with a two-year multi-year card. If you are a family reunification beneficiary, you will be issued with a general multi-year card valid for a maximum of four years.

It is also possible to apply for **exceptional admission to stay on humanitarian grounds** on the Simplified Procedures website of the Prefecture in your area of residence. Though, this procedure is rarely used.

If you are an Algerian national, you are not protected by these provisions.

I am victim of forced prostitution in France

If you are a victim of **forced prostitution** and you file a complaint or testify against the perpetrators, you can obtain a 'private and family life' residence permit that authorises you to work.

You will need to provide the following documents:

- proof of civil status
- proof of nationality
- proof of address dated within the last six months
- 3 recent passport photos
- a receipt for the complaint or legal proceedings

It is also possible to apply to the Prefecture for **exceptional admission to stay on humanitarian grounds**. Though, this procedure is rarely used.

If you are an Algerian national, you are not protected by these provisions.

I would like to apply for a residence permit for my child who entered the country as a minor

If your child has **lived in France since and before the age of 13 with one of their legitimate parents**, they can apply for **French nationality at the age of 18 and/or a one-year 'private and family life' residence permit**.

If your child is an **Algerian national and has lived in France since and before the age of 10**, he/she can apply for a **10-year residence certificate at the age of 18**.

If your child is a **Tunisian national and has lived in France since and before the age of 10**, he/she can apply for a **temporary residence permit at the age of 18**.

I have been living in France for 5 years and my children are in school

If you have been in France **for more than 7 years and your children have been attending school in France for at least 3 years**, you can obtain a 'private and family life' residence permit.

You will need to provide the following documents:

- proof of civil status
- proof of nationality
- proof of address dated within the last six months
- 4 passport photos
- proof of residence in France for 5 years (tax documents, dated documents, etc.)
- school certificates

You can contact the Réseau Education Sans Frontière (RESF) for assistance with this process, see page 9.



FAMILY REUNIFICATION

Family reunification: if you are recognised as a refugee or benefit from subsidiary protection and wish your family to join you in France

You can bring your family members to France, if they are:

- Your spouse (husband or wife), your cohabiting partner or partner with whom you lived in another country before arriving in France.
- Your children from a previous relationship under the age of 18 for whom you have custody.
- Your spouse's children under the age of 18 for whom he/she has custody.

Please note: if the union or marriage took place after the date on which you submitted your asylum application, this will be a different, more difficult family reunification procedure.

How can you bring your family over?

1/ Your family must apply for a **long-stay visa at the French Consulate** closest to their place of residence.

You will need the following documents:

- a completed form
- your family members' passports
- 4 passport photos per member
- proof of your OFPRA protection
- a copy of your birth and/or marriage certificate.
- proof of parentage (birth certificate, among other things) and proof of contact with the person (money transfers, call records, etc.)

The review of the file costs €99.
2/ Once the application has been registered at the consulate, the person must make an **appointment at the French embassy in the country**.

The Refugee Families Office will ask you for:

- a copy (front and back) of your residence card or receipt
- a form concerning your family situation
- proof of address

3/ The procedure can take a long time.

- If the long-stay visa is granted, **your family has 3 months to travel to France**.
- If the visa application is refused or if you do not receive a response from the consulate, **you have 2 months to lodge an appeal**.

How can I get help?

You can contact the associations La Cimade and Safe Passage for assistance with your application (see page 9).

- The SPADA or the accommodation centre where you were staying while your asylum application was being processed:
They can assist you in claiming your rights, finding a new address and accommodation.
- The municipal social services centre (CCAS) in the town where you live or are staying:
Request an appointment with a social worker to get help with the process and to submit an application for social housing.

Family Reunification: if you have a residence permit and wish your family to join you

If you have a residence permit, **you can bring your spouse and underaged children to France under certain conditions**.

You must be able to prove that you:

- **Have the right to reside in France:** a residence permit valid for at least one year (employee/private and family life/student/visitor, etc.) or a resident card or a receipt for the renewal of one of these permits
- **Have been residing legally in France for 18 months:** residence permit valid for more than 1 year, residence card, long-stay visa, residence permit valid for less than 1 year, temporary residence permit, asylum application certificate
- **That you and your partner have stable financial resources (salaried employment, assets, retirement pension):**
 - For 2 or 3 people: €1,766.92 per month over the last 12 months.
 - For 4 or 5 people: €1,943.61 per month over the last 12 months.
 - For 6 or more people: €2,210.30 over the last 12 months.

Please note: family benefits and the revenu de solidarité active (RSA) are not taken into account.

- **Have accommodation that is suitable for the size of your family:**
 - The criteria depend on your local authority, but you can use this simulator:
<https://www.service-public.fr/simulateur/calcul/zonage-abc>
 - Minimum: 22 m² for a couple without children, plus 10 m² per additional person (for more than 8 people, add 5 m²).

Your family must:

- **reside abroad**
- the spouse you wish to bring over must be of **legal age and legally married to you**
- the **children** you wish to bring over must be **minors, born to you, from your other relationship(s) or from another relationship of your spouse if the other parent does not have parental authority**

Keep your documents

Keep all your documents:

- government documents, hospital documents, AME, dated letters
- school attendance certificates, school reports
- bills in your name

Applying for citizenship for my child

If your child was born overseas and was **recognised by a French parent before reaching the age of 18**, he/she automatically has French nationality. If your child is **adopted by a French person**, he or she will automatically obtain French nationality.

If your child was **born in France to foreign parents**, he/she can apply for naturalisation at the age of 13.

To automatically obtain French nationality, the following will be required:

- **proof of birth in France**: birth certificate
- **proof of residence in France for at least 5 years**: school certificates, internship certificates, etc.

If your child arrived in France before the age of 13, he/ she may apply for naturalisation at the age of 18.

I want to divorce my violent partner

Domestic violence is considered misconduct and may be recognised as grounds for divorce. You may be entitled to damages.

I want to protect my child from being abducted by their other parent

If you think that the other parent may take your child abroad without your permission, **you can refer the matter to the family court judge, who will initiate emergency proceedings**.

Your child's main residence will be established at your home, and you can request that your spouse's passport be marked to indicate that the child may not leave French territory without the permission of both parents.

In an emergency, you can also **go to the police station to request that the child be prohibited from leaving French territory**. You will need to bring:

- your identity document
- your child's birth certificate
- proof of address, a certificate of accommodation

TAKING CARE OF YOUR CHILD(REN)

Finding a place in a maternity ward

Registering for a maternity ward allows you to monitor your pregnancy and prepare for childbirth.

You can fill out an online form at: https://aima.sante-idf.fr/app_direct/aimaidf/. You can also call this number: 01 46 34 00 60

If you do not receive a reply, your file will be forwarded to AIMA, who will help you find a place. You can contact AIMA for any difficulties related to maternity ward registration and pregnancy monitoring.

Childcare

1/ Children aged between 2 years and a half and 3, can attend municipal childcare during the day. You do not need a residence permit to enroll your child in childcare.

You must register your child at the district or city council office:

- fill in an online form on your council's website after you are more than 6 months pregnant
- confirm your registration by bringing the following to the council office: your identity document, your child's identity document, your family record book, your child's birth certificate, your tax notice or proof of income.

You may be asked for a certificate of accommodation/proof of residence and a reason for having your child looked after (work, training).

- You can also go directly to the town hall where you live or are staying.
- Some nurseries offer emergency childcare, which allows for faster admission and gives families the option of arranging full-time or part-time childcare.

The cost of childcare will depend on your income. In Paris, you will pay a minimum of €4 per day.

Once you know which childcare your child will be attending, **make an appointment within 10 days to bring in the registration documents**.

2/ If you are a single parent and are looking for work, you can apply to enrol your child aged 0 to 3 in an AVIP childcare if you are in one of the following situations:

- you are registered as a job seeker
- you receive RSA income support
- you are a job seeker and a single parent
- you are a job seeker and you live in a neighbourhood classified as 'politique de la ville'
- you are a job seeker, you are under 25 and you do not have a diploma

If your child is offered a place in an AVIP childcare, you will also receive social and professional support. You can visit a France Travail agency for more information.

Enrolling your child at school

School is **compulsory from the age of 3 for everyone**, even if you do not have a residence permit and/or accommodation.

1/ For maternelle and primary school, you must go to the town hall of your district/town:

- your identity document
- your child's birth certificate
- a vaccination record

2/ For collège and lycée, you must go to the education authority in your department:

- Paris : Académie de Paris : 12 boulevard d'Indochine, 75019
- Seine-Saint-Denis : Académie de Créteil, 4 Rue Georges Enesco, 94000 Créteil

If this is your child's first time attending secondary school in France, they will need to take a language test at CASNAV in Paris or at the CIO in other cities in the Île-de-France region. To assess their level and determine whether they need extra French lessons (UPE2A class), you will need to make an appointment.

To register your child, you will need to bring:

- proof of identity
- your child's birth certificate
- school reports if your child was previously enrolled in another city in France and a certificate of deregistration from their former school (unless they are changing levels, e.g. nursery school to primary school, primary school to college, or college to lycée)
- proof of residence or accommodation

If the academy does not accept your proof of residence, you must:

- bring the school certificate of another of your children who is enrolled in school
- ask your social worker to write a social report attesting to your situation and your ties to Paris or Seine-Saint-Denis. If possible, ask them to come with you.

Registering your child for the school canteen

1/ Primary and collège in Paris:

To enable your child to eat in the canteen at their primary or collège in Paris:

- Register directly with the school or at the local council office.
- The price of meals varies according to parental income. To pay an amount appropriate to your situation, you must go to the school cashier's office at the town hall of the district where your child attends school with:
 - your identity document
 - your child's birth certificate
 - your latest tax notice (if you do not yet

have one, you can ask your social worker to provide you with a certificate of your financial situation)

- The price of meals varies from 0.13 cents to 7 euros in Paris.

This pricing will be applied to all your children's extracurricular activities (afternoon tea, extracurricular activities, study sessions, etc.). So don't forget to send it to Paris Famille (the organisation that manages extracurricular activities) so that the correct rate is applied to your bills.

You can submit this pricing information directly on your Paris Famille account (<https://familles-portail.paris.fr/>) or visit the office at: 210 quai de Jemmapes 75010 Paris.

2/ Schools and collèges in Seine-Saint-Denis:

To enable your child to eat for free in their school canteen if you live in Saint-Denis:

- book online: you must create a personal account on the saintdenienligne.fr website
- book by filling in a paper form at the town hall.

To enable your child to eat in the canteen in Seine-Saint-Denis:

- Collège : You must complete this online form to register: <https://restocollege.seinesaintdenis.fr/magic-link/>

- Maternelle and primary school: ask your child's school how to do this or go to the town hall/CCAS (social services centre) in the town where your child goes to school.

The price of a meal ranges from €0.33 to €6.40 depending on your income.

To get a cheaper meal price, you will need to show proof of your situation: a CAF certificate less than 3 months old, your tax notices or a letter from your social worker when registering for the canteen.

3/ Secondary schools (lycées) in Paris and Seine-Saint-Denis:

For your child to eat at their secondary school canteen in Paris and Seine-Saint-Denis:

The price of a meal ranges from €0.50 to €4.58 depending on your income.

To get a cheaper meal price, you will need to show proof of your situation: a CAF certificate less than 3 months old, tax notices or a letter from your social worker when registering for the canteen.



ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES

Obtaining your income tax notice

Having a tax notice is useful for your administrative procedures. You must do this every year. The first application is made using a paper form that you can find online or at the tax service centres for individuals (SIP). If this is not the first time you have filed your taxes, you can do so online (<https://www.impots.gouv.fr/accueil>) with your tax reference number and a code that was sent to you on your tax notice.

To file your taxes, you will need:

- Proof of identity (passport, identity card, residence permit, etc.)
- Proof of address and proof of residence as of 1 January
- Your bank details (RIB)
- Your marriage certificate if you are married. If you are not married, you must file your taxes separately. If you have children together, they can only be declared on one of your tax returns.
- A birth certificate for each of your children

Obtaining an accommodation certificate (115 Paris)

Having proof of accommodation is useful for your administrative procedures.

If you are staying at the 115 emergency shelters in Paris, you can obtain your certificate on the website <https://115.paris/> : "I request proof of accommodation".

You can also ask a social worker for help.

If you are staying at the 115 emergency shelter in the 93 department, you can request a **certificate of accommodation by calling 115**. You can also ask a social worker for help.

Asking for financial support

You can apply for **financial assistance from the local council because you have children**.

You can undergo the administrative procedures with the help of a social worker:

- In Paris: at an Espace Solidarité Insertion (ESI) or a Permanence Sociale d'Accueil (PSA), with a social worker (see pages 14,15).
- In Seine-Saint-Denis: at the CCAS, maison des solidarités
- If you have a residence permit, you can go to the Centre Communal d'Action Social (CCAS) in your town.

Please note: there is no guarantee that your application will be successful. It depends on your situation.

Single parent allowance

If you are **raising your child(ren) alone, have a low income and hold a residence permit**, you can apply for the single parent allowance:

- Apply 6 months after separating from your spouse.
- Prove that you have the right to be in France.

You can complete the application on the CAF website or visit their offices.

The allowance will be **paid until your youngest child reaches the age of 3**.

Domiciliation

A registered address is an administrative address where you will receive your mail. It is necessary in order to begin any administrative procedures. You will generally need guidance from your social worker. There are also

ACCOMODATION

Call 115 for emergency accommodation

You can **call 115 if you need accommodation: it is free and you do not need to have a residence permit**.

Many people call 115, so you may have to wait several hours before someone answers. **You will need to call several times until you hear the welcome message, then stay on the line until someone answers**.

When you get through to someone, explain your situation.

You will have a better chance of getting emergency accommodation if you call at 8 o'clock in the morning and you are in one of the following situations:

- You are more than 7 months pregnant.
- You have children under 3 months old.
- You have a serious medical condition.
- You have been a victim of violence.

You can also try calling at 8pm to see if you can get a last-minute place.

Obtaining a long-term accomodation

To access stable accommodation, you must contact a social worker who will submit a request for stable integration on your behalf via the SIAO.

This request is a lengthy process, generally taking several months or even years. The request must be updated every three months by your social worker to ensure its continuity. Access to accommodation is unconditional.

If you are in a regular situation, you can also apply for social housing. You can do this either with your social worker or directly at the town hall.

You can ask for a «diagnostic MVS» to get a more stable housing at the «**Maison de la Veille Sociale**» (MVS), with a social worker or by calling the 115. It's the «SIAO» request.

The waiting period for accommodation is very long. Families and sick people are given priority. **You must confirm your file every six months with the MVS or 115 and report any changes in your situation (address, telephone number, family, etc.).**



Accessing healthcare for you and your child

1/ As an asylum seeker who has been in France for at least three months, you are eligible for health insurance coverage through the **Universal Basic Health Coverage (PUMA)** and **Supplementary Health Insurance (CSS)** programmes as soon as your asylum application is registered. **This covers your medical and hospital expenses for yourself, your spouse (if they are legally resident) and your children free of charge.**

Tip: Choose health centres or make sure that there are no additional fees, i.e. that your healthcare professional is categorised as sector 1.

You can get help with this process from:

- The organisation where you are staying
- The organisation responsible for supporting you while your asylum application is being processed (SPADA)
- Certain associations (see page 8)
- The social services department of the hospital where you are already receiving treatment.

If your child is applying for asylum alone, it is possible to apply for PUMA just for him/her. You will need to have the child's asylum application receipt and CAFDA coverage.

2/ If you are in an irregular situation: **the AME entitles you to medical and hospital care**, within the limits of the Social Security rates. You do not need to pay upfront.

Please note that some types of care are not covered. It is important to check that the care you need is covered before receiving it. This applies in particular to certain dental and ophthalmological treatments.

Advice: Choose health centres (CMS) and call them before you go to make sure they accept

the AME. They are legally obliged to accept it, but this is often not the case.

You can obtain the AME if:

- You do not have a residence permit, asylum application receipt, or document certifying that you are in the process of obtaining a residence permit.
- You have been residing in France and are in an irregular situation for more than three months without interruption.
- Your income does not exceed a certain amount:

The conditions regarding length of stay and income do not apply to children: they only need to have parents in an irregular situation to be eligible for AME.

For them, the application can be made as soon as they arrive in France.

First AME application:

- Download: <https://www.ameli.fr/sites/default/files/formulaires/formulaire-ame-s3720h.pdf> or pick it up directly at a CPAM reception desk.

- You will need: your identity document and those of your children (if you have a passport, you will need photocopies of all pages, even blank ones), proof of address and proof that you have been in France for more than 3 months and less than a year, and proof of income if you have any.

NB: you must declare a certain income. If you enter 0, you will not be eligible for AME.

- Submit your AME application at a CPAM reception desk in your place of residence. If this is your first application, you must go to the CPAM counter with your passport. If it concerns a renewal, you can send it by post.

- If you are an unaccompanied minor, or if you are unable to travel to submit the application (reduced mobility), you can send the application by post with proof of your situation or a sworn statement.

To visit a CPAM reception centre, you must make an appointment:

- By telephone on 36 46

- At CPAM reception centres

- In exceptional circumstances, at a healthcare facility or PASS at the hospital where you are receiving treatment.

You can ask for help in putting together your application at one of the following organisations:

- Communal or inter-communal social action centre (CCAS) in your place of residence
- Day centre (page 13,14)
- Hospital social services (page 17)
- Associations (page 8)

The CPAM must inform you of its decision within two months. If the application is accepted, the person can collect their AME card, which is valid for one year from the date of application. Please note that renewal is not automatic; you must reapply two months before the card expires.

3/ **If you are pregnant and/or have children under the age of 6, you can also go to a Maternal and Child Protection Centre (PMI):**

- Free of charge, regardless of administrative status
- Reception, advice, consultations, workshops, interviews

Abortion

You have the right to have an **abortion up to the end of the 14th week of pregnancy, regardless of your administrative status**. If you decide to have an abortion, **you must contact a doctor to prepare for the procedure**. If the doctor refuses, you will need to see another one.

If you are a minor, you will need to see a social worker. It is advisable to go to a family planning centre:

Contraception

Contraception refers to all methods used to prevent pregnancy and protect against sexually transmitted infections and diseases (STI and STD).

In France, contraception is free in all pharmacies for those under 26 years of age.

GENERAL ADVICE

Transport Discounts

You can pay less for transport:

- If you receive Revenu de Solidarité Active (RSA) income support: your travel pass is free
- If you have AME health insurance: your travel pass is 50% off
- If you have PUMA health insurance: your travel pass is 75% off
- If you are a student receiving a grant, you may be eligible for a discount, depending on the amount of your grant.

You can apply for this on Solidarité Transport: <https://www.solidaritetransport.fr/>

Prices for children:

- Under 4 years old: their travel pass is free.
- From 4 to 11 years old (not including 11): travel pass at £24.80 per year (Imagine R Junior).
- 12 to 18 years old: pass costs £384.30 per year (Imagine R Scolaire). You will need to speak to the school social worker to obtain discounts or refunds. It is possible to pay in installments.


